Youngest Network to Ever Win Emmy Honored During First Primetime
Telecast of Category

SAN FRANCISCO, CA — Sept 16, 2007 — Current TV, the peer-to-peer news and information network for young adults, has been recognized for its visionary leadership with an Emmy® Award for Outstanding Creative Achievement in an Interactive Television Service. The youngest network to ever win an Emmy, Current was awarded the honor last night during the first ceremony to include the category in the Primetime telecast. Other nominees in the category included MLB Mosaic, Bravo Media, DisneyChannel.com Broadband Video Player and BIAP Fantasy Football Television Tracker.

Co-founded by Al Gore and Joel Hyatt, Current is a pioneer of a non-traditional television model that incorporates both online and broadcast elements into its programming. Viewers are empowered to make, shape and create the network's broadcast line-up through Internet submissions of content, a model that forms the cornerstone of the network's production infrastructure.

"As demonstrated by how far Current has come in the past two years, the idea of participation and interactivity in media is one that resonates not only with our viewers, but also with the Academy of Television Arts and Sciences," said Al Gore, chairman of Current.

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Since its launch in 2005, Current has become the fastest growing network on television by expanding from 17 million homes in the United States to more than 51 million homes worldwide through its innovative combination of television programming and its comprehensive online studio at www.current.tv. Current viewers play a significant role in the network, creating their own short reports called "pods" for the television broadcast on a range of themes from serious social issues, to music, style and political humor. Called VC² (Viewer Created Content), these videos are submitted to the Current website where registered users vote for what will air on television. One-third of all Current's on-air programming is created by its audience. VCAMs (Viewer Created Ad Messages) enable viewers to create unique spots for Current's growing number of partners such as Toyota, L'oreal and T-Mobile, among others.

"We're honored to receive this Emmy and pleased that the Academy is emphasizing this important category," said Joel Hyatt, CEO of Current. "Current's mission is to open up television and to help our young adult viewers participate creatively in a global conversation not only on television, but online as well. Current will continue to pioneer new participatory media formats."

Launched August 1, 2005, Current TV is the only 24/7 cable and satellite television network produced and programmed for and by its audience. Current TV connects young adults with what's going on in their world, in their own voice, offering programming that's authentic, often surprising and consistently compelling. Aiming to democratize TV by providing viewers with editorial control, Current pioneered the television industry's leading model of interactive viewer created content (VC²). Comprising roughly one-third of Current's on-air broadcast, this content is submitted via short-form, non-fiction video "pods", viewer created ad messages (VCAMs) and mobile video.
